Tango Networks Names Industry Veteran Alastair Westgarth to CEO Position

Bartek, who will assume the role of chairman on the company's board of directors.

"Tango Networks is so fortunate to have had Doug Bartek as co-founder and our first CEO," stated Westgarth. "His role in getting this company off the ground has been invaluable. I'm looking forward to continuing to work with him closely on the board of directors as we move the company into full deployment mode, providing the most seamless fixed-mobile convergence solution to mobile operators and large enterprises around the world."

"Starting a company is like birthing a baby, and turning over the reins in this case is like giving that daughter away in marriage to a man you respect and admire," said Bartek. "I'm truly looking forward to being an integral part of Alastair's vision to take Tango Networks to the next level."

Bartek added that the changes reflect Turner's original plan to step down as chairman once Tango had completed its first funding round and established a succession strategy.

"Alastair's acceptance of the CEO and president position culminates many months of discussion and planning by the board. This move allows me to continue in a strong role here at Tango, with an emphasis on future opportunities," Bartek said.
