**Tango Networks Introduces the Tango Abrazo,
the Industry's First Hybrid Mobile Phone-PBX Solution**

Provides First Look at Innovative Carrier-Enterprise Solution at CTIA Wireless 2007

ORLANDO – March 27, 2007 – A converged telecommunications solution that truly integrates any mobile phone with any office telephone system made its debut today at the CTIA Wireless 2007 event, as Tango Networks introduced the Tango Abrazo™.

The Tango Abrazo is the ultimate pragmatic approach to fixed-mobile convergence (FMC) enabling mobile operators to integrate all mobile phones with any corporate PBX, Centrex or Unified Communications network. Tango Networks, which emerged last month from stealth mode, unveiled the Abrazo at the industry's largest wireless event, in Booth #1441.

The Tango Abrazo, which takes its name from the opening move of the Tango dance ("Abrazo" means "embrace"), unites the mobile phone network with the enterprise voice network, turning every mobile phone into a true PBX/Centrex extension for both incoming and outgoing calls. Employees need only give out a single phone number, and calls can reach them wherever they are working. Every call from either phone has access to all the company's advanced corporate calling features and corporate dialing plans, as well as a single, unified voice mailbox.

Other fixed-mobile convergence solutions on the market today are either entirely enterprise-based or carrier-based. The Tango Abrazo, however, is based on a unique hybrid architecture that includes both carrier and enterprise components. Supporting both legacy and IMS industry standards, the solution enables wireless operators to offer a value-added FMC service that easily integrates the mobile network with the customized environments of its enterprise customers. Each enterprise retains control over its users and corporate information, without the need for carrier management and support.

Unlike other offerings that require expensive dual-mode handsets, the Tango Abrazo works with any existing mobile phone, and requires no special client software to manage. Each Tango Abrazo supports a few hundred to more than 25,000 users in the enterprise, and works with legacy TDM, hybrid, or IP PBXs, so the Tango Abrazo supports, but doesn't require, an enterprise's migration to IP.

"Many of the other solutions on the market today take minutes off the carrier network and keep service providers out of the equation altogether," said Andrew Silver, chief technology officer and co-founder of Tango Networks. "Not only does this complicate the delivery of a seamless experience for the end user, but also requires that enterprise IT departments essentially build and maintain their own voice-grade RF networks.

"The Tango Abrazo utilizes the best of the carrier network and the best of the enterprise voice communications network, marrying the two to create a truly unified, integrated experience that benefits all stakeholders in the mobile ecosystem: carriers, enterprises, and end users."

A carrier deploying the Tango Abrazo can leverage its relationship with an enterprise, opening the door to enterprise-wide agreements, reducing customer support demands, decreasing churn, and growing market share. It is an effective counterpoint to enterprise-driven moves toward voice over Wi-Fi or other solutions that move minutes off the carrier's network.

For the enterprise, the Tango Abrazo creates an unprecedented level of control over mobile phones. By leveraging the internal corporate network, mobile callers can use convenient four- or five-digit dialing for internal calls, while the IT department can enforce corporate policies for wireless phone use, utilize least-cost routing plans, and track, monitor, and record all wireless calls, just as it can calls from corporate desk phones. Not only can enterprises achieve significant cost savings, but can generate tremendous gains in productivity, accessibility, and customer satisfaction.

The Tango Abrazo is currently being tested in various customer environments and is anticipated to be generally available in late second quarter 2007.
